From the Pastor's Pen:

Grace Notes November 2017

Galatians 3:15-16¹⁵ "We who are Jews by birth and not sinful Gentiles¹⁶ know that a person is not justified by the works of the law, but by faith in Jesus Christ. So we, too, have put our faith in Christ Jesus that we may be justified by faith in Christ and not by the works of the law, because by the works of the law no one will be justified.

We just celebrated the 500th anniversary of the Reformation. The Reformation was started with the issue of indulgences, but the heart of the matter was really about faith and justification. Justification is the word the Scriptures use to describe how we are made right with God. In the Scriptures, it means most literally, to be declared right (or alright or satisfactory) in Gods' sight. This doesn't happen because we have always done the right thing; we haven't. Rather, God has graciously forgiven our sins for the sake of Christ.

That might sound a bit philosophical, but the practical upshot is supremely practical and relevant. We don't have to live up to the standard of perfection. Perhaps more accurately we don't have to pretend to be perfect or good, because the reality is we all make mistakes, and we all have issues and struggles.

Paul is crystal clear, no one is justified before God by following the law: not even the Jews, who were God's chosen and holy people. God had been leading them for millennia, he'd been providing them with extra guidance and protection. Yet they still were falling short and not doing a good job of following the law. In fact many of the Pharisees were obsessed with trying to follow the Torah (Old Testament laws) and Jesus said they were not doing a better job of following God, but actually doing a worse job of what God wanted.

Yet thanks be to God for Jesus Christ our Lord! We are made holy and right in God's sight because of what Jesus has done for us, not because of anything we have done. That is why there is nothing more important in life than trusting in Christ, because he alone can save.
